Mildred Clingerman

Mildred McElroy Clingerman was born in Allen, Oklahoma, on March 14, 1918, and moved with her mother and sister to Tucson in 1929. She was graduated from Tucson High School, and then attended the University of Arizona.

She married Stuart Kendall Clingerman, a construction superintendent. in 1937 and they subsequently had two children. a son and a daughter. During World War II. she worked at a flight-


training school while her husband was in the Army – the only job she said she ever had outside the home.

Writing

In the 1950s, Clingerman was well-known as a science fiction (SF) and fantasy writer and was widely published in The Magazine of Fantasy & Science Fiction -- as well as in slick periodicals such as Atlantic, Colliers, Good Housekeeping, and Woman's Home Companion. In 1960 a paperback edition of her short stories, A Cupful of Space, was published by Ballantine, her only book published during her lifetime. Her stories also appeared in several anthologies, including literature textbooks for middle and high school students.







The Clingerman Files: Collected Works, containing her previously uncollected and unpublished stories, was published in 2017.

Other Activities

Clingerman was a charter member and a founder of the Tucson Writer's Club and was active in the Tucson Press Club, serving multiple terms


on its Board of Directors. She was also a collector of books of all kinds -- especially those by and about Kenneth Grahame -- and of Victorian travel journals.

She won the Cordwainer Smith Rediscovery Award in 2014.

Some Concluding Comments

Despite her popularity during the 1950s and early 1960s, Clingerman is almost completely forgotten today. In fact, she is not listed in any of the recent reference works on science fiction. Moreover, Sharon Yntema's More Than 100 Woman Science Fiction Writers doesn't have Clingerman listed as a main entry (despite including data on 104 other female authors from English-speaking countries). Clingerman is only listed in an appendix of 170 additional names of female SF writers. In this "additional names" entry, moreover, no biographical data are provided, only the title of her one book, A Cupful of Space, which is identified as a collection.

When she was mentioned in genre reference books, Clingerman was usually described as "an occasional writer" -- which, on reflection, I suppose she was.

She herself described her writing as an avocation. Still, at one time, her "shapely stories" which "wed a literate tone to a sometimes sentimental cuteness" were enjoyed very much by her fans.

She died on February 26, 1997, aged 79.
