The Legacy of Heinlein Bob Jennings



On July 7, 1907 Robert Anson Heinlein was born in Butler, Missouri, the third of seven children. Arguably the most important science fiction writer of the 20th century, during the course of his lifetime he wrote 32 novels and 59 short stories, with his stories collected into 16 separate anthologies.

Heinlein's early years were devoted to getting an education thru and serving in the US Navy. In 1924 he lied about his age to get into the Missouri National Guard. After graduating from high school; he wanted to attend the Naval Academy, but his older brother Rex was already a student there and at the time naval regulations prohibited multiple members of the same family from attending military service academies.

This did not deter the young Heinlein. He aggressively solicited help from Missouri senator James Reed to give him a recommendation with an exception to the one person per family rule. Due to Senator Reed's influence Heinlein was admitted as a student in June of 1925, graduating in 1929.

He subsequently served as an officer in 1931 on the new US aircraft carrier, the *Lexington*, and later as a gunnery officer on a destroyer. In 1934 he was given a medical

discharge from the navy; he had developed pulmonary tuberculosis. The discharge came with a small stipend which did not go far as he was into his second marriage at this point and trying to become involved with liberal Democratic politics. He worked a number of different jobs, but decided to try writing in the hopes that he could bring in enuf money to help pay down his house mortgage.

His first attempt at writing was a novel, *For Us the Living, a Comedy of Customs* finished in 1939, a book that never saw print during his lifetime. More of a lecture on politics, human morals, marriage, and social responsibility than a story, it was rejected by every publisher he submitted it to, and he sent it to many during his lifetime.

His first published work was a short story titled "Life-Line" published in the August 1939 issue of *Astounding Science Fiction*. Originally written to be submitted as an entry in a story contest promoted by Hugo Gernsback in *Thrilling Wonder Stories*, Heinlein sent it to editor John Campbell first, mainly because *Astounding* paid better rates than *Thrilling Wonder*. Campbell immediately recognized Heinlein's writing skills, and bought the story at the magazine's regular penny a word rate. This was followed immediately by "Misfit", published in the November issue.

Buoyed by this early success Heinlein began to write full time, turning out three short novels, four novelettes and seven short stories in that first year alone, all of which sold to Campbell at *Astounding*. There was so much Heinlein material coming in that Campbell was compelled to assign some pen-names to his work, keeping with publisher Street & Smith's policy that no author should be credited with more than one story per issue. Heinlein's pseudonyms may have

fooled some of the magazine's readers, but they were well known in science fiction fandom. He was easily the most popular writer of the new decade, and was the guest of honor at Denvertion, the 1941 World Science Fiction Convention.

The success of his stories came from his compelling writing style as well as the ability to create future societies that were different, with unique technological developments and different social norms, yet were peopled by believable human characters who had problems and emotions that the reader could easily identify with. Sometimes the story themes were problems directly related to future scientific developments, sometimes they were related to social and political problems that had developed along with the new scientific innovations. When Heinlein wrote, he wrote directly to the heart and mind of his readers, and made the plots directly relevant to them.

Thru the years Heinlein's writing emphasis changed as the century marched on. He was looking to sell to better paying markets, and was the first stf writer to break into the slick magazines, with sales of science fiction stories to *The Saturday Evening Post*, and adventure stories to *Argosy*, which had become a gloss paper men's magazine in the mid 1940s. He was also one of the screen play writers for *Destination Moon*, drawing many elements from his novel *Rocket Ship Galileo*.

In the 1950s he wrote twelve books theoretically aimed at the juvenile market, many initially serialized in *Boy's Life*, the Boy Scout magazine, or *The Magazine of Fantasy & Science Fiction*, then published in hardback by Scribner's. Each new novel was released before Christmas to capitalize on the seasonal sales rush. Tho marketed for the juvenile market, they clearly featured adult themes and problems being faced by younger protagonists. These books were extensively purchased by libraries and were often the first introduction many young people had to the world of science fiction literature, serving as essential stepping stones to get new readers involved with the genre.

That series stopped with *Starship Troopers* in 1959. Rejected outright by Scribner's as being too violent, too controversial, too mature, and too politically oriented for the juvenile market, Heinlein broke with Scribner's. The book was published by Putnams' who became the publisher for most of his subsequent novels.



In his later years Heinlein became a more controversial writer as his political viewpoints became sharply more conservative, but losing none of his popularity among the science fiction community. A complex personality, it has been suggested that some of his later stories were written as satires, or attempted humor, such as the story of a teenage pizza delivery boy who gets sucked up by aliens, and manages to save the entire galaxy from destruction, then returns to earth and immediately resumes his career as a pizza delivery boy. Or *Podkayne of Mars*, a story which functions only if every character in it acts like an idiot, with the nominal "hero" being Podkayne's brother Clark, a scientific genius who also happens to be a paranoid sociopath who hates human beings. Or *The Number of the Beast* where Heinlein decided, possibly on a dare, to recreate the world of Barsoom, Edgar Rice Burroughs' sword and sandal version of Mars, by using an alternate universe hopping time machine gimmick.

His stories were often nominated for Hugo Awards, and he won four during his lifetime. After his death he won six "retro Hugo Awards", a category created in 1996 to honor significant stf works from the years before the Hugo Award were created in 1953. The Science Fiction Writers of America named Heinlein its first Grand Master in 1974.

His distinctive writing style, plus his use of legitimate, well constructed hard science concepts made him a leading voice during the golden age of science fiction. His dominance of the field extended in the following years up until his death in 1988, while his influence on the writing style of science fiction has been universally acknowledged. His stories have remained both entertaining and relevant thru the years. All of Robert Heinlein's science fiction and fantasy stories are in print, with many available in pixel format on many internet sites including Project Gutenberg.

Bob Jennings has been involved in fandom since the late 1950s, and is one of the original founding members of comics fandom, founding the SFPA and publishing hundreds of fanzines. From 1979 to 2000, Bob ran a science fiction/comics/game store, which is now all mail order. He's currently at work to develop a device that will zap robo-callers and internet spammers.

Hi Mindy and Jason;

The newest issue of *FanActGaz* arrived, and I thot I would send along a few comments.

Since the Plague hit I have pretty much given up attending conventions of any kind, even the ones taking place only a few miles away from me. I passed on the Total Confusion game con over in Worcester, and also Boscon in Boston. Unfortunately nowadays it seems that every convention I hear about involves people who come away with COVID or some other form of ConCrud that seems to take weeks to recover from, and I just don't want to put up with that.

Back in the days of the past century I used to go to a lot of conventions, usually as a dealer selling books and goodies in the huckster room. There were sufficient conventions around the immediate New England region to keep me busy, plus in those days there were collectible shows, comic conventions, and classic movie events. The COVID crisis put an end to a lot of that, altho I am pleased to see that stf conventions seem to be making a strong comeback, in spite of the extremely expensive hotel room rates that seem to be the norm now.

The farthest I ever went to a convention was out to Niagara Falls for a science fiction con back in the early 1980s. It was a hell of a long drive out and back, and to make matters worse it was a crummy convention. Attendance was around thirty people or less, some of whom did not stick around for the whole con either. Most of the programming didn't take place, so most of the people who did attend clustered around the dealer's room and the hotel bar.

In that time period the city of Niagara Falls looked like it had been abruptly abandoned sometime around 1946. There were plenty of empty houses, boarded up businesses, and some old dilapidated stores hanging on for dear life, and that included the hotel, which apparently only stayed in existence when someone needed a really cheap venue to host a wedding party or a family reunion. Or, a science fiction convention. Needless to say I didn't even come close to breaking even on that excursion, and my buddy and I didn't have much fun either.

The woman who put on the convention got the hotel space for very little money, so little that she was able to book it again the following year. She hyped the second convention as being a complete reformation. Everything was going to

be different. All the kinks had been worked out, a new, energetic staff had joined, new programming was in the works, new name guests were booked, blah blah. The dealer room rates were cheaper, to make up for the "bad" convention the previous year, and of course, like an idiot, I fell for it and signed up for that second convention.

Needless to say there was nothing new or different, except the hotel bar had shorter hours this time round since the fans the first con had not indulged heavily in malted brews or spirits as had been anticipated. If anything the attendance was even worse than the previous year, and altho there was an attempt to provide panels and some programming, it was mostly a feeble effort, with the events mostly breaking down to people just sitting around and talking.

After losing lots money plus wasting two very long dull weekends out of my life, I decided to keep my convention going much more local in the future. I'm happy to say that is one resolution I have been able to keep.

• Alderson, Ben. A GAME OF MONSTERS. [REALM OF FEY #4]. Angry Robot, 24.99 tp.

Duncan Rackley, former fey Hunter turned lover, has become the host of the demon god Duwar, and the gentle peace that has been brokered is steps away from being shaken up. Bolstered with the sudden help of his ex-love Erix,Robin embarks on a mission to save Duncan, seeking out the aid of the Nephilim once more. However, Robin finds that the game of the gods is not over, and those he can trust may have other motives.

• Arena, Brittney. A DANCE OF LIES. Random House Canada, 38.00 hc.

Vasalie Moran was once a dancer in King Illian's court - until he framed her for murder. Barely surviving her two years in the dungeons, she's suddenly called to face her king. He offers her a deal. • Asher, Neal. DARK DIAMOND. [TIME'S SHADOW TRILOGY #1]. Tor UK, 33.99 tp.

Captain Blite knows that someone, or something, is trying to kill him. But a device he possesses, known only as the dark diamond, won't let that happen. After surviving a series of accidents and assassination attempts, Blite comes to realize that whenever he dies the dark diamond reverses time to a moment before his death. He must then go through the traumatic experience again and again until he escapes. This attracts the attention of Polity agents and the crab-like p-Prador, determined to manipulate the device for their own purposes.

• Parry, H. G. A FAR BETTER THING. Tor, 25.99 tp.

The faeries stole Sydney Carton as a child, and made him a mortal servant of the Faery Realm. Now, he has a rare opportunity for revenge against the fae and Charles Darnay, the changeling left in his stead. It will take magic and cunning - cold iron and Realm silver - to hide his intentions from humans and fae and bring his plans to fruition. Shuttling between London and Paris during the Reign of Terror, generations of violence-begetting-violence lead him to a heartbreaking choice in the shadow of the guillotine.
