

Religion and Science: A Response to H.G. Wells Bob Jennings



In September of 1917 the A.C. McClug Company published a new hardcover book: *The Messiah of the Cylinder* by Victor Rousseau. Dated October, the book was actually released in late September and was a reprint of a serial of the same name that had appeared in *Everybody's Magazine* June thru September of that same year. Rousseau originally conceived the story as a religious response to the sterile materialistic dystopia portrayed in H.G. Wells' novel *When the Sleeper Wakes*.

Wells envisioned a socialist future society perverted by greedy, short-sighted individuals who ruled a soulless scientific dictatorship. Rousseau had more action and adventure in his tale, plus he injected strong religious themes into the narrative, something that had not been done before.

This was a new concept at the time. Christian themes were considered verboten in the science fiction stories of the period. Science was regarded as the ultimate realism, while religion, with its reliance on revealed insights into morality and divinity, plus the belief in supernatural beings and miraculous occurrences, were considered incompatible with the strait scientific dictates of the period. The idea that Christianity could become a viable theme for a science fiction novel was never seriously considered, until Rousseau managed it with this story.

Victor Rousseau had a checkered career as a writer. Born in England in 1879, he began writing at the age of 21, producing a humorous mainstream book based on his own experiences in the calvary

during the Boer War. Using money from that sale he came to New York in 1901. He worked as a reporter for several papers, and also wrote short fillers and travel vignettes for newspaper syndicates. He held a series of editorial positions with different magazines, but never managed to last very long. His first true fiction sale was in 1905 writing short pieces aimed at children for newspaper syndication under the name V.R. Emanuel.

While serving as an editor for *Harper's Magazine* he wrote his first fantasy stories, about a protagonist who believed hypnotism and faith could drive out ghosts, thwart curses, and deal with other supernatural evil. These stories were distributed by several newspaper syndicates but did not place with many papers. Eleven of these stories were recycled by Rousseau who claimed they were original works when they were sold to *Weird Tales* in 1934.

In 1913 he emigrated to Canada with his wife and two children where he wrote Canadian based stories of life in the Canadian wilderness, and adventures outside Canada's big cities. These stories and novels were his most popular and successful works.

Rousseau wrote *The Messiah of the Cylinder* in 1914, and it was sold to *Everybody's Magazine*, but they kept it in inventory for a long time, possibly believing that the Great War then underway made such a fantastic adventure inappropriate. It is unknown whether Rousseau threatened to sell the story independently to a book publisher or whether the magazine finally ran the novel as a serial which McClug optioned.

Rousseau wrote several other science fiction stories, as well as outdoors adventure stories which he sold to top of the line pulp magazines such as *All Story* and *Argosy*. He began turning out stories of all kinds for the pulp magazines. He wrote a few screen plays for Universal, and several of his western stories were turned into movies in the 1920s.



Somewhere along the line he developed a serious problem with alcohol.

He briefly returned to England, but found he couldn't sell to the British markets. He returned to the United States where he wrote more science fiction and fantasy, and turned out lots of material for the True and true confessions markets.

In the 1930s he became a regular writer for the Spicy line of pulp magazines under the name Lew Merrill. He had at least one story in most issues of *Spicy Mystery* for years. He recycled old stories and unsold manuscripts, adding sex and weird menace themes and turned out risqué material as fast as he could. It is those "Lew Merrill" stories, particularly the weird menace thrillers that solidified his reputation with the science fiction community.

He stopped writing in the late forties, unable to adapt to the decline of the pulp magazines and the changing world of popular fiction.

His weird menace sex stories are the things that most fans are interested in, but his earlier science fiction novels, particularly *Messiah of the Cylinder*, are his strongest works of the fantastic. His best written material were stories set in Canada dealing with outdoor life. In my opinion the quality of his writing deteriorated over the years, so that by the late 1920s he was writing and selling lots of fiction, including science fiction and supernatural stories, but most of it wasn't very good.

Messiah of the Cylinder is a story that is difficult to summarize. It is an experience in fantastic eugenics and science gone wild, mixed with religious themes and an almost mystic reverence for the ancient days before civilization changed for the worse. The hero is

alternately a vicious amoral scientist and a compassionate reformer who spreads the mythology of a golden age of faith and religion that can somehow redeem this strange new world that has almost eliminated individual freedom and crushes the essence of humanity out of its citizens.

Messiah of the Cylinder has been reprinted several times in this new century, and the complete text is available for free reading or downloading at many internet sites, including Project Guttenberg. It is a strange, unusual, oddly moving tale that still retains its appeal, more than a hundred years after it was originally published.

Bob Jennings has been involved in fandom since the late 1950s, and is one of the original founding members of comics fandom, founding the SFPA and publishing hundreds of fanzines. From 1979 to 2000, Bob ran a science fiction/comics/game store, which is now all mail order. He's currently at work to develop a device that will zap robo-callers and internet spammers.

FANAC Fan History Project - Seattle Newsflash Digital Recording project launches!

FANAC.org will be travelling to Seattle for Worldcon, and we have something big to tell you.

SFOHA and more – Several years ago, we announced that SFOHA had turned over their audio recordings to FANAC. Our goal has been to digitize them and make them available. Now, FANAC Board member Laurie Mann has taken the lead in accomplishing this. As of today, we have about 50 recordings on line at https://fanac.org/Recordings/

In addition to the SFOHA tapes, there are recordings from NESFA, Worldcon committees and the FANAC archive. There are interviews, panel discussions and Guest of Honor speeches, with the earliest so far being interviews by Fred Pohl of Hal Clement and Lester del Rey in the late 60s. Let us know if you have recordings that belong in this archive!

History on the Move: We have arranged with the 2025 Seattle Worldcon (August 13-17) to have a scanning station at the con, to scan and digitally archive more fanzines. This has been exceptionally helpful and successful at past conventions.

Coming to Seattle? Please help us grow this digital archive of fandom. If you're a fanzine editor, bring your old fanzines to the fan table area at the con. If you have convention publications not already online, bring them too (fanac.org/conpubs/). We will try to scan them onsite and give them back to you at con. Bring memorable and worthwhile fanzines by other editors as well. We will reach out to them for permission before we put them online. And now, bring your convention audio cassette recordings too. We'll try to get them digitized too, before the convention is done.

We do have to unstaple and restaple the zines to scan them. If they are perfect-bound, we may not have time at con.

If you can, please drop us a note (to **Fanac@fanac.org**) telling us what you are bringing so we can be prepared.

Stop by and say hello: Even if you don't have fanzines or other pubs to scan, stop by the table and say hello, and pick up your history ribbon. We'd like to see you!

How big is it? The archive has over 27,500 fanzines, more than 6,300 convention pubs, a YouTube channel with 169 pieces and now 50+ audio recordings on FANAC.org. There are over 550,000 pages of fannish publications so far.

• Akers, Tim. The Eccentrics [Knight Watch #3]. Baen, 12.99 pb.

Led by the eighth incarnation of Nikola Tesla, the Society of Eccentric Geniuses protects the Mundane world from the horrors of the Gestalt, a timeline of the future that never was. Powered by SCIENCE and steam, the Eccentrics travel the world in their airship, righting wrongs and rescuing troubled suitors, mad scientists, and optimistic engineers, often from monsters of their own creation. But now something new threatens the Gestalt, and they need help from John Rast and the heroes of Knight Watch.

• Anders, Charlie Jane. Lessons in Magic and Disaster. Tor, 41.99 hc.

Jamie is basically your average New England academic-in-training. She has a strong queer relationship, an esoteric dissertation proposal, and inherited generational trauma. But she's also a powerful witch. Her mother Serena has been hiding from the world in an old one-room schoolhouse for several years, grieving the death of her wife and the simultaneous explosion in her professional life. So Jamie's busy digging into a 300 year old magical book, but she still finds time to teach Serena to cast spells and help her come out of her shell.

• Anderson, Justin Lee. Damned King [Eidyn Saga #3]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

The eternal light keeping demons at bay has been extinguished and Eidyn's last bastion is under brutal siege. Aranok and his allies draw the final battle lines as the war for the kingdom nears its end. With death threatening from every shadow and truth itself at stake, Eidyn's defenders must put aside their grudges and come together. But is it possible to save everyone when some prefer the lie?

• Andrews, LJ. The Ever King [The Ever Seas #1]. Ace, 39.99 hc.

For years, Erik, the scarred king of the Ever Kingdom, has thought of nothing but vengeance against the man who killed his father and trapped him beneath the waves, making him a prisoner in his own realm. Until his enemy's daughter unintentionally breaks the chains on the Ever, and Erik makes her the unwitting pawn in his vicious game of revenge. She's innocent. He's vicious. But he will take back what he lost, no matter the price. Unless she steals his heart first.

• Bado, Chinaza. Birth of a Dynasty. Voyager, 37.00 hc.

After witnessing the massacre of everyone he's ever known and loved, M'Kuru Mukundi, the sole surviving member of the High Noble House Mukundi of Madada, flees to a small village where he hides under the guise of farm boy Khalil Rausi... unaware that the real Khalil's father is the bloodthirsty general of Zenzele's army, and under the direction of the King's scheming son, Prince Effiom, was responsible for the murder of M'kuru's people. And now, when an imposter claiming to be M'kuru shows up in the village, the real M'kuru - now Khalil - must bide his time amongst his enemies, pretending to be everything that he hates in order to get vengeance.

• Brackston, Paula. The Haunting of Hecate Cavendish [Hecate Cavendish #1]. Griffin, 25.00 tp.

England, 1881. Hereford Cathedral stands sentinel over the city, keeping its secrets, holding long forgotten souls in its stony embrace. Hecate Cavendish speeds through the cobbled streets on her bicycle, skirts hitched daringly high, heading for her new life as Assistant Librarian. The cathedral houses an ancient chained library, wisdom guarded for centuries, mysteries and stories locked onto its worn, humble shelves.

• Broadbent, Carissa. The Fallen & The Kiss of Dusk [Crowns of Nyaxia #4]. Bramble, 41.99 hc.

When a goddess offers them a final path to redemption - and back to each other - Asar and Mische embark on an extraordinary mission. Together, they must seize the power of the god of death so Asar may do the impossible: ascend to true divinity. But as the underworld teeters on the brink of collapse and the gods prepare for a war, Asar and Mische must decide what they are willing to sacrifice for the power to defy death.

• Brown, Gareth. The Society of Unknowable Objects. Morrow, 25.99 tp.

The three current members of a secret society meet every six months in the basement of a bookshop in London, pledged to protect their archive of magical items hidden away, safe from the outside world - and the world safe from them. But when Frank Simpson, the longest-standing member of the Society of Unknowable Objects, hears of a new artifact coming to light in Hong Kong, he sends Magda Sparks - author by day and newest member - to investigate. Within hours of arriving in Hong Kong, Magda is facing death and danger.

• Carson, Scott (=Michael Koryta). *Departure 37*. Emily Bestler, 39.99 hc.

On a clear October day, the American skies empty after hundreds of pilots refuse to fly, triggering a complete ground stop. The pilots all received disturbing, middle-of-the-night calls from their mothers, and each mother had a simple and urgent request: do not fly today. There are a few concerning elements to the calls. None of the mothers remember making them - and some of the mothers are dead. While the nation's military chiefs and artificial intelligence experts mobilize in search of answers, a 16 year old girl named Charlie on the coast of Maine watches a strange, silvery balloon drift across the water and toward her home - a place she loathes.

• Caruso, Melissa. The Last Soul Among Wolves [The Echo Archives #2]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

She arrives to find an unexpected reunion of her childhood friends - plus her once-rival, now-girlfriend Rika Nonesuch, there on a mysterious job. Then the will is read, and everything goes sideways. Eight potential heirs, half of them Kem's oldest friends. Three cursed relics. The rules: one by one, the heirs will die.

Cheon, Seon-Ran. The Midnight Shift. Bloomsbury, 38.99 hc.

When four isolated elderly people die back-to-back at the same hospital by jumping out of the sixth-floor window, Su-Yeon doesn't understand why she's the only one at her precinct that seems to care. But her colleagues at the police force dismiss the case as a series of unfortunate suicides due to the patients' loneliness. But Su-Yeon runs into a mysterious woman named Wanda at the crime scene, who claims to be a vampire hunter.

• Cogman, Genevieve. Elusive [The Scarlet Revolution #2]. Tor UK, 21.99 tp.

Eleanor, once a lowly English maid, is now a member of the League of the Scarlet Pimpernel. Eleanor and the League are investigating the disappearance of Charles-Maurice de Talleyrand, the notorious French statesman and diplomat. But they soon uncover two vampire parties feuding for power, and learn that Talleyrand's disappearance is part of a bigger, more dangerous scheme - one that threatens to throw France into bloody chaos.

• Cogman, Genevieve. Damned [The Scarlet Revolution #3]. Tor UK, 44.99 hc.

1794. Eleanor, once a lowly English maid, is now a member of the League of the Scarlet Pimpernel and a promising conjuror. With a vampire plot thwarted in Paris, the League's next daring rescue is of the Pimpernel's beloved wife, Lady

Marguerite, imprisoned in her London townhouse on unjust charges of treason and espionage. But Lady Marguerite's captivity is only the first threat from the League's vampiric enemy.

• Corey, James S. A. The Mercy of the Gods [The Captive's War]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

The Carryx - part empire, part hive - have waged wars of conquest for centuries, destroying or enslaving species across the galaxy. Now, they are facing a great and deathless enemy. The key to their survival may rest with the humans of Anjiin. Caught up in academic intrigue and affairs of the heart, Dafyd Alkhor is pleased just to be an assistant to a brilliant scientist and his celebrated research team. • Dawson, J. R. The Lighthouse at the Edge of the World. Tor, 40.99 hc.

At the edge of Chicago, nestled on the shores of Lake Michigan, there is a waystation for the dead. Every night, the newly-departed travel through the city to the Station, guided by its lighthouse. There, they reckon with their lives, before stepping aboard a boat to go beyond. Nera has spent decades watching her father, the ferryman of the dead, sail across the lake, each night just like the last. But tonight, something is wrong. The Station's lighthouse has started to flicker out.

As a child, Kissen saw her family murdered at the whim of a fire god. Now, Kissen makes a living killing gods, and she enjoys it. Then she discovers a god she cannot kill. Skedi, a small god of white lies, has somehow bound his life to that of a young noble girl, and they desperately need Kissen's help. Joined by a disillusioned knight on a secret quest, the trio must travel to the ruined city of Blenraden, where the last of the wild gods reside, to each beg a favour.

But his survival instincts are put to the ultimate test when he and four other grunts are given a deadly mission: venture into the perilous No Man's Land to euthanize a wounded comrade. With her powers much depleted, and food supplies running low, will they even survive the journey? • Mehta, Tashan. Mad Sisters of Esi. DAW, 39.00 hc.

• Ringo, John & Lydia Sherrer. Behind the Veil [TransDimensional Hunter #3]. Baen, 40.00 hc.

When Lynn Raven set out to win the championship for groundbreaking augmented reality game TransDimensional Hunter, the worst she thought she'd face was sunburn, mosquito bites, and annoying spectators. The more she plays, though, the higher the stakes become - and the stranger the obstacles she has to face. From dodging fans-turned-stalkers to managing inter-team sabotage to surviving the increasingly bizarre antics of a game algorithm that seems to have it out for her, Lynn isn't sure how much more she can take.
