More Good News from Your President!

Last month we had a Zoom meeting for some of the N3F's active members. We discussed things that could be done to advance the N3F. Some of them happened. Jean-Paul Garnier designed and ordered 2500 N3F bookmarks. Most members with papermail addresses were sent several and a cover letter. Our web pages at N3F.org were improved. A dropdown list was created on the top page. If you want to download one of our advertising fliers, the PDFs are right there. One of the rotating banners was defective. It has been removed.

I was asked to send leading figures the URLs and passwords for our social media sites. We actually have a lot of them. Information was circulated to some of the active members.

We discussed new active bureaus that the N3F would benefit by having, in particular a Welcoming Bureau, a Multimedia Bureau, a NefferCon Bureau, a Professional Support Bureau, and a Social Media Bureau. The Welcoming Bureau would target putting the N3F name in front of the fannish public, for example at cons. Indeed, we now have members who attend conventions regularly and have volunteered to take N3F Fliers and bookmarks to the conventions that they attend. The Professional Support Bureau is working on projects. Jason and Mindy Hunt expressed an interest in the Multimedia Bureau.

I don't have much to say this month. Son of Silvercon III was modestly successful, seeing an increase in memberships which also means an increase in N3F members; we'll be doing it again next year. If you are prepared to do things for the N3F, or are already doing them, please advise if you would like to be added to the invitation list for the next meeting.

Advertising in various zines was discussed. That's a continuation from the previous meeting. We agreed to place full-page ads in Alternacomics, Crisova, Worlds of If, and Galaxy. There was a desire to have electronic ad files in a format that preserves layers, so that they can be re-arranged to fit different page sizes.

We will try to get table space at SF conventions. Thanks to Cedar Sanderson, we will be represented at PCON. We expect to be represented at EagleCon and LosCon. There was enthusiasm for having representation at BasedCon and LibertyCon. These are smaller conventions where we might be able to get table space.

BookMarks were sent to members having papermail addresses. That's about 200 of our nearly 300 members.

The Laureate Awards were discussed. There was enthusiasm for ensuring that there are more nominations for each award.

We are currently publishing 12 zines. They are: A Gentle Stroll, Eldritch Science, Fan Gazette, Films Fantastic, FrankinZine, Ionisphere, Mangaverse, N'APA, N3F Review of Books Incorporating Prose Bono, Origins, The National Fantasy Fan, and Tightbeam.

Members confirmed that they had received the club's URLs and the corresponding password lists. A single email address for our social media pages will be created. Mindy and Jason will investigate Instagram and Tik-Tok accounts.

Once upon a time we had a trifold. I can look for it.

Zoom Activism

Last month Zoom activists agreed to create N3F bookmarks. Jean-Paul Garnier did the beautiful designs. We voted and spent something under \$150 to generate several thousand of them. We also voted up to \$500 for other advertising. Close to 600 bookmarks were distributed to N3F members with papermail addresses. (That's about 200 of our nearly 300 members, including some who appear to have gafiated so we no longer have working email addresses for them.) We have several members who attend conventions. They are being sent packages with several hundred bookmarks. This weekend Cedar Sanderson took them to PCon where she is their 2025 artist. On her art display, beyond all her beautiful artwork, she has stacks of bookmarks for passersby to take.

With respect to this month's meeting, there has also been action. New ads having the needed dimensions were designed and will be appearing in Worlds of If and Alternacomics. Ads for other locations will be placed soon. The unified social media address was created.

Zines

Our newest zine is A Gentle Stroll, focused more or less entirely on Dungeons and Dragons and other role-playing games. Unlike all other N3F zines, A Gentle Stroll is only available by subscription: you must contact George Phillies (phillies@4liberty.net) and ask to be added to the subscription list. Subscriptions are currently free; at some point toward the end of the year contributors will be asked to join the N3F, which can cost as little as \$5 per year. A Gentle Stroll is one of the two successor zines to Lee Gold's Alarums and Excursions, which recently folded after a fifty-

year run. AGS doesn't have that many contributors yet, but so far we've maintained a warm and friendly tone. AGS will soon be releasing issue #5. All members are welcome to contribute; submissions as pdf files are due by the last day of each month to George Phillies, phillies@4liberty.net.

The National Fantasy Fan, now in its 84th year, continues its regular monthly appearance as our primary news-of-the-N3F. The current issue is Volume 84, Number 9. TNFF, also known as 'The Fan', was originally titled 'Bonfire'. Last month we made a moderate change in the contents and appearance of The Fan. We certainly agree that a better organization of our articles would help readers find things, but are not yet quite sure how to do that. Your advice would be most appreciated. George Phillies and Jon Swartz, co-Editors.

Tightbeam, originally Hyperspace Tightbeam, was launched by Marion Zimmer Bradley as our letterzine. Since then, it has changed titles, merged with TNFF and then unmerged, and is now our all-topic review zine. We try to cover everything from anime to SerCon, but also including books, comics, films, videos, TV shows, poetry, short stories, and would happily cover cosplay if submissions became available. The current issue is #372. Editors George Phillies and Jon Swartz try their best to see that all branches of fandom are covered within its 20-page limit

Origins, the magazine of the history of science fiction and science fiction fandom, has been revived by Sam Lubell. His first issue, #71, covers among others N3F Founder E.E. Smith.

Our original all-topic APA is N'APA, founded in 1959. The current issue is #278. All dues-paying members are welcome to contribute. Comments on other zines in past issues are traditional and appropriate. To add your own zine to the collation, write it, convert it to a PDF file, and send it to Official Collator Jefferson Swycaffer, abontides@gmail.com. Published bimonthly, N'APA covers all topics of possible interest to fen. Founded in 1959, at different times it has been a letter zine, a center for discussing the future of the N3F, with reviews and fiction also common. Our recent experiment is to encourage

members to publish fan fiction, stories of almostfamiliar characters with the serial numbers sanded off.

Mangaverse is the revived magazine of the N3F anime and comics bureau. Kevin Trainor wombat.socho@gmail.com is the BuHead; Patrick Ijima-Washburn patokon.com@gmail.com is the zine editor.

Ionisphere, the ionic sphere that draws together all fen and pros, is the bimonthly zine of the Fan-Pro Activity Coordinating Bureau. The Bureau and its zine exist to increase interactions between readers and writers, publish interviews with writers and fen, promote contact information and web locations, and support convention activities. For the next issue, a listing of active SFFH zines will appear.

Films Fantastic, our fanzine dedicated to science fiction and fantasy films, just published issue 20. The N3F Laureate Awards, first given in 1941, are the oldest awards in SF Fandom. They are given for especially meritorious contributions to science fiction, broadly defined, over the past year, on a wide range of topics, such as best fanzine and best novel. Dues-paying N3F members are entitled to nominate for Laureate Awards; they vote to decide who wins.

Gourmet Bureau

The Gourmet Bureau presents wonderful recipes, in particular recipes inspired by famous authors. Cedar Sanderson does much of the cooking.

Games Bureau

The Games Bureau supports the play of games by N3F Members. Board games, rolegames, miniatures, diplomatic games, live action roleplaying, eurogames, and more are all within our remit. Franking Service

The Franking Service performs the original purpose of the N3F, redistributing fanzines to our membership at less than the cost of postage. Our work is purely electronic, using the internet to retransmit fanzines. The Service functions by collecting fanzines, compressing all zines received in a given month into a single downloadable file, and placing the file onto the N3F web pages where it is available to download. The downloadable files comprise its publication Frankinzine.

Fan-Pro Coordinating Bureau

We are here to encourage new writers, to reward the new kids on the block. we want writing that is not that good. We want stories from people who don't know their object from their subject, who don't know where commas go, and who use apostrophes to denote plurals -- but who have a story to tell. We want stories from guys and gals nobody's ever heard of...but in the years ahead, we will.

- 1. This contest is open to all amateur writers in the field, regardless of whether they're members of the National Fantasy Fan Federation. For the purposes of this contest, we define an amateur as someone who has sold no more than two (2) stories to professional science fiction or fantasy publications.
- 2. Stories entered in the contest must be original, unpublished, not longer than 8,500 words in length—and related to the science fiction, fantasy, or similar genres in the opinion of the judge.
- 3. Email attachments of Word documents are acceptable for submission. Manuscripts on paper should be typed, single sided on 8 1/2"-by- 11" white paper, double spaced, with pages numbered. The name of the author should not appear anywhere on the manuscript to ensure impartial judging. Photocopies are acceptable, if they are of good quality. Computer printouts must be legible.
- 4. Contestants can enter up to three stories. Enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope (SASE) if you would like your story returned at the end of the contest. Stories will not be returned without an SASE. Do not send your only copy in case of accidental loss. We are not responsible for lost manuscripts.
- 5. Email entries will be accepted. Send to Jefferson P. Swycaffer at aboutides@gmail.com. No guarantee can be made of email receipt. Privacy and property rights will be absolutely respected. No one other than the Short Story Judge will ever see the submission.
- 6. There are no entry fees.
- 7. Cash prizes totaling \$100 will be awarded as follows: First prize is \$50, second \$30, and third \$20. Honorable mentions and semi-finalists will receive a certificate of award.
- 8. Send all manuscripts to the contest manager: Jefferson Swycaffer, P. O. Box 15373, San Diego, CA 92175-5373; abontides@ gmail.com. Emails with the story attached in word format are preferred. Paper manuscripts are acceptable. All entries must be received or postmarked no later than Dec. 31, 2025.
- 9. The Short Story Judge is a published science fiction professional, and also a loving fan of the sf and fantasy genres. All comments and critiques are solely the Short Story Judge's opinion, but he promises to be constructive and polite.
- 10. Stories will also be reviewed by the Editor of the N3F Fiction zine Eldritch Science; authors of suitable tales will be invited to submit their tales for publication in our zine. This review and invitation will only occur after contest winners have been announced, so it can have no effect on the contest outcome.
- 11. The NSF may want to publish an electronic book including top entries from one or more years of publication. You will not be contacted about this until after the contest is over and prizes have been awarded. If we want to publish your story, you will have to sign over to us first world serial rights. Your willingness to sign over rights cannot affect whether or not you win the contest. Winners will be notified as soon as the judging is completed. Announcements and notifications of winning entries will be made by March 2026. Please take your time and submit your best work. You can resubmit stories previously entered if they did not win previously. All entries will be kept confidential and will be judged fairly and anonymously. The deadline for all entries is Dec. 31, 2025. Good luck!
