Boskone Meeting 2025-11-2

Meeting started at 12:12 pm EST

Maria (Chair): We're having a convention. Things are moving along. I'm going to need help with various areas, especially liaisons. I'll need people to interface with our science speaker, special guest, and master of ceremonies. Please reach out if you're interested. Rachel Bitterfield has agreed to produce pre-con newsletters/progress reports. We'd like to do these 2 weeks prior to con, 1 month prior to con, and 2 months prior to con.

Sharon (Ribbons): We need to inventory our leftovers from last year. Please bring in any leftovers you may have stashed so that they can be included. We will need to get our order into Hodges by mid-January, so getting our counts in by mid-December would be a good idea.

CORRECTIONS TO THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: None this month.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (SHARON SBARSKY):

The big thing this month is the appointment of Boskone 64 chair. I'm pleased to appoint Mike Kerpan to this role. We will need a secret ballot. There is some discussion about the wisdom of appointing somebody so soon after they last did the job. Mike says that he agrees that we need a bigger talent pool and would like somebody to shadow him to learn more about the sausage-making to prep for a future year as con chair.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT (STEPHANIE SHIELDS):

My reports will come under gaming and Kickstarter.

TREASURER'S REPORT (TIM SZCZESUIL):

CLERK'S REPORT (MICHAEL KERPAN):

Clerking has continued. There is some state paperwork that I have to take care of this month.

EBOARD REPORT (MIKE KERPAN):

The eboard set the price of the POD paperback *Letters to the Pumpkin King* at \$15, with no discounts.

RULES COMMITTEE REPORT (DAVE ANDERSON):

Not present. No report. Sharon asks the rules committee to investigate Opavote as an alternative system for handling secret ballots.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT (GAY ELLEN DENNETT):

Dave C. reported two new members by email: Jessica Karnis and Emily Low.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT (RICK KOVALCIK):

We are working to catch up on bookkeeping so that we can file our 2024-2025 form 990. We were successful in reducing our insurance cost (including clubhouse and books at PSSC) by about \$1800 to \$9600.

Stephanie asks about the status of audits. Sharon says that they still need to be done. Rick says that these need to get done, but the Form 990 and 2024-25 bookkeeping are the highest priority. We're meeting weekly with the bookkeeper. We're catching up on our bookkeeping at a rate of 2-3 months per month and are currently just 6 months behind.

BOSKONE 62 REPORT (JONI DASHOFF):

Sharon reports that Judy is still working on the books but things are delayed due to medical stuff.

BOSKONE 63 REPORT (MARIA DAGGETT):

Things are going well. Live links for program, volunteers, dealers, art show, etc. We need more guest liaisons. We have a shopper but could still use more help there. We have plans in place for social media promotion and progress reports.

NESFA PRESS REPORT (DAVE GRUBBS):

News:

- A Kickstarter to fund the printing of *Dubious Pleasures* (the B63 GoH book by Greg Cox) is now active. This is where you can order a signed copy of the book. And it is the place to reserve a spot in a Greg Cox, Charles Urbach, or Keith DeCandido kaffeeklatsch. Please visit and consider purchasing something or making a donation. Any money we collect this way will be applied to printing costs.

There are plans to start a new one.]

- NESFA Press could still use some help.

New Printed Books:

- Work on the Greg Cox Boskone 63 GoH book, *Dubious Pleasures*, is nearly finished. We have a few nits to pick out of the bibliography, and we still await the final version of the dust jacket illustration.
- Someone suggested that we produce a collection of works by the winners of the Cordwainer Smith Rediscovery Award. Anyone want to help with that? Or take it on as editor?
- Charles ("Chuck") Lang has proposed that NESFA Press publish editions of public-domain material, for which Chuck would create new illustrations. We are considering the idea. We presume such books would feature many good visuals—though we haven't yet considered any specific titles.
- We continue to seek more hardcover projects. If you have a project in mind, we can help.

Reprints:

- Brown's *From These Ashes* (including the additional short story we found recently) and *Martians and Madness* have been uploaded to the Print-on-Demand section of Barnes & Noble. We will have trial hardcover copies in hand shortly. Once we are happy with them, we will order a small number of copies for sale on our e-commerce site.
- Bujold's *Dreamweaver's Dilemma* (11th printing of the paperback format) is scheduled for completion on November 4th, 2025, and will show up in a truck for storage at Tim and Ann's about a week after that.
- Seanan McGuire's *Letters to the Pumpkin King* has been uploaded to the Print-on-Demand section at Barnes & Noble. We received a trade paperback proof copy for review. It looked great, and we have ordered about 12 copies for sale on our e-commerce site.
- Predictions show that within the next year, we will also run out of Eric Russell's *Entities*, van Vogt's *Transfinite*, Zelazny's V4: *Last Exit to Babylon*, and the second edition of the Ellison biography *A Lit Fuse* (which we plan to delay reprinting until we run out of the first edition, which is still selling well on Amazon). At this point, we have enough money to reprint one, which would most probably be Zelazny Z4. We hope to make the others available in small quantities via Barnes & Noble print-on-demand, similar to what we are doing with the Brown books and *Letters to the Pumpkin King*.
- A longer-term NESFA Press project is to typeset the Hymnals (NESFA Song Books) in InDesign, with the music entered into Sibelius (a music typesetting system).

eBooks:

- We are still awaiting a response to our request for ebook rights for *The Compleat Boucher*.
- We have acquired ebook rights to *Dreamweaver's Dilemma*, which will be available soon.
- We have the ebook rights for the Boskone 63 Cox book, which will be available in February, along with the hardcover.
- The ebook updates for the two Brown books, to match the updated Print-on-Demand editions, will be available soon.
- The ebook state of *The Ides of October* is still on the table. The contents are far too complicated and change too fast for physical reprints to be reasonable, but an ebook could be updated quickly and regularly. Chris Kovacs is prepared to provide updates.

Technical items:

- The NESFA Press shared drive contains files for every NESFA Press project we found on our original "N:" drive, as well as any projects we have created, updated, or collected from editors of older NESFA books.
- Our master ISBNs file is located in the NESFA Press shared Drive, in the 01-Management/Catalog/ISBNs.docx folder. An extracted text file named ISBNs.txt sits beside it for easy searching.

NESFA SALES REPORT (TIM SZCZESUIL):

Sales continue. The next month is usually our highest sales volume of the year.

We received 951.98 for eBay sales last month, up somewhat from the month before.

Rick reported that the vote to confirm Michael Kerpan as Boskone 64 chair has completed and Mike was confirmed 13-5.

BOSKONE 64 (MIKE KERPAN):

Thank you for appointing me. As mentioned earlier, I'm actively looking for somebody to serve as a deputy/shadow to learn more about the sausage-making and prepare to take on the role in a future year.

E-COMMERCE REPORT (SHARON SBARSKY):

The new edition of *Letters to the Pumpkin King* is online. We'll be looking at getting Miva set up for Boskone book preorders in the next month or two.

KICKSTARTER (STEPHANIE SHIELDS):

We're 27% funded. 35% of funding has come from direct tracking. 19% of funding has come directly from Kickstarter's internal discovery functionality, 14% came from Facebook. 7% came from people who followed our pre-launch page. 4% came from the discovery landing page. 3% came from, Kickstarter search. 2% came from Discord. 1% came from Google.

Lis asks about the ability to add on bookmarks to certain rewards. Stephanie says that she'll see about fixing this. We may also tweak the other add-ons. We need a backup plan in case things don't succeed.

OUTREACH COMMITTEE (KRISTIN SEIBERT):

We're searching for art for the windows. We bought the clubhouse almost exactly 40 years ago, so happy birthday NESFA clubhouse. There's some discussion about holiday events, possibly a NYE party. Sharon reports that the window display seems to lure people in. Paula suggests some sort of story time event. People ask about possible readings. Mycroft points out that kids sometimes mess up the Window Display. There is debate about how to fix this.

HALLOWEEN PARTY (STEPHANIE SHIELDS):

We had a Halloween Party despite my injuries. Kristin helped a lot, as did Mike and Paula. We had 15-20 people.

BOSTON BOOK FESTIVAL (RICK KOVALCIK FOR GAY ELLEN DENNETT):

We made about \$1100 in book sales at the Boston Book Festival. All but about 280 copies of the giveaway book (*One Right Thing* by Bruce Coville) were given away by about 12:30. We probably could have sold more copies of some of the sales books if we had brought more copies. Thanks to Gay Ellen for running sales, Kelly for help in packing the books, and Mycroft for unpacking the books after BBF. Besides Gay Ellen, Mike Kerpan and Julia Tenney helped during the BBF and Kelly and Rick helped with setup and teardown.

SALES AT CONVENTIONS (BOSKONE) (SAUL JAFFE):

Our tables are pencilled in, and he wants the list of members earlier, along with the correct membership forms. We also need a full list of all non-discountable items. We need to figure out a way to handle year-ahead registrations at NESFA Sales after registration closes on Sunday. Sharon says that last year, reg stayed open a couple of hours late for year-ahead only. We can do something similar next year, with better signage.

Sharon says that we should consider whether to do sales at LAcon. We haven't been out west for a while, but we also haven't heard any great demand, and shipping would be expensive.

CLUBHOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT (RICK KOVALCIK/STEPHANIE SHIELDS):

Work was done on the front windows. We still need to do work on the gutters and should do something with the bathrooms. Rick has more details.

Rick reports: While it may have happened before the last meeting, reporting it apparently wasn't in the minutes of the last meeting. The roof leak over the tool chest in the back seems to have been due to the downspout elbow being totally clogged, leading to several inches of standing water on the flat roof. Rick went up on a ladder and removed the elbow. It still needs to be replaced.

The blue trash can was returned by the developer next door after we asked about it. People are reminded that our trash should go in the blue trash can and not the rolling carts that belong to the building next door.

With help from Julia, Kelly, Nancy, and Rick, we cleaned up the windows to the left of the left door in the main room of the clubhouse, removed the insulation and dirty paper, and put up blackout curtains, some of which have a space theme. Then, with help from Nancy and Rick, we replaced the out-of-date redundant sign to the left of the door to the blue room with another version of the curtain with the space theme. Finally, Julia redid some of the out-of-date signage, replacing the sign on the blue room door and the sign to the left of the main room door. (All directions are viewing the clubhouse from outside of the front.) We plan to continue work on cleaning the windows, removing dirty papers and dirty curtains, and putting up fresh curtains similar to the others.

We also plan to work on the back downspouts before snow to deal with the icing of the parking lot. We still need to put up the replacement emergency lights (already purchased) and replace the second bathroom heater / fan (already authorized).

Mycroft mentions that we need to plug up holes along the outside.

Mike Kerpan started working on a clubhouse opening checklist.

Mycroft also says that we need to work on the weatherstripping and the area around the air conditioners to better seal them. Stephanie says that we should pick a day and do it.

IT COMMITTEE REPORT (RICK KOVALCIK):

No overall report.

COMPUTER REPORT (RICK KOVALCIK):

No report. Paula reports that the computers sometimes attempt to update themselves at inopportune times.

WEB REPORT (SHARON SBARSKY):

Maintenance is ongoing.

SOCIAL MEDIA REPORT (SHARON SBARSKY):

We need to figure out Rose's schedule.

GAMING COMMITTEE REPORT (STEPHANIE SHIELDS):

Game Days have been happening. We've received a request for a Space Base expansion. We're also looking into various RPGs. We're also considering running a miniature tournament or something. Donations are always welcome.

HOTEL COMMITTEE REPORT (GAY ELLEN DENNETT):

No report submitted. The usual bits about getting your info to Hotel in a timely fashion applies.

HOTEL SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT (PAUL KRAUS):

No updates from last month.

LIBRARY COMMITTEE REPORT (MIKE KERPAN):

We have a library. LB and Nancy have done a lot of work organizing and maintaining the collection. Now that the shelf reading is mostly done, our collection numbers should start going back up.

We also held a book fair. Attendance was low thanks to some competing events that we hadn't known about when we scheduled it, but we still raised about \$300 in donations.

MAIL ROOM REPORT (RICK KOVALCIK):

I continue to pick up the US Mail from Framingham about once a week.

PROCUREMENT REPORT (DAVE ANDERSON):

No report.

NESFA FELLOWSHIP (WES BRODSKY) :

Nominations close on 11/5.

GAUGHAN AWARD (JONI DASHOFF) :

Sharon reports that Joni has been connected with past judges and things are moving along.

SHORT STORY CONTEST (KYLIE SELKIRK)

Sharon reports that stories have been sent out to first-round readers. Kristin confirms this. We received 16 stories this year.

SKYLARK AWARD (JOE ROSS) :

We received two nominations. The ballots will be going out this week and will be due sometime in mid-December.

CLUBHOUSE AND ONLINE ACTIVITIES (WEDNESDAY NIGHTS, READING, WRITING, OTHER):

No report.

MEDIA COORDINATOR REPORT (MIKE KERPAN):

Turkeyfest is coming. It's lots of fun and only slightly painful.

NESFA PICNIC (SHARON, AS PRESIDENT):

After much discussion, we think we should try for Sunday 9/6 or, if it's not available, Monday 9/7.

MCFI LIAISON (RICK KOVALCIK)

We had our annual meeting and are starting to think about a future project (Costume Con in a future year).
2026 Relaxacon will be the last weekend in May (the weekend AFTER Memorial Day).

Also, any CR box in a room that is occupied SHOULD be turned on when more than one person is in the clubhouse. Moved (Rick Kovalcik, Mike K) that any money donated at a Book Fair or in the Library Donations Jar/Pig be added to the Library budget for purchasing books, dvds, etc., effective retroactively to 10/1/2025.

Motion passes by unanimous consent.

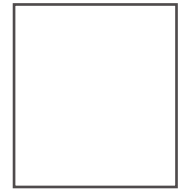

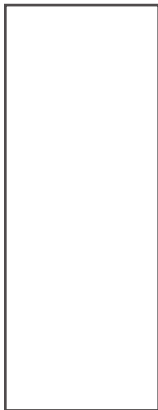
